Hugo 2D (PG)

Director: Martin Scorsese. **Starring:** Asa Butterfield, Johnny Depp, Chloë Moretz, Christopher Lee. 126 mins.

Martin Scorsese's adaptation of Brian Selznick's unforgettable children's story *The Invention of Hugo Cabret*. Asa Butterfield is young Hugo, an orphan living secretly in a big train station in 1930s Paris. When he encounters a broken robot-like machine, an eccentric girl, and a reserved old man who runs the toyshop, he is thrown into a magical, mysterious adventure that could put his clandestine life in jeopardy – or lead to something better.

When the Crown Prince of Austria dies and Inspector Lestrade declares it was suicide, Holmes steps back to see the big picture. But little does he realise that Professor Moriarty is about to commit a crime that will shock the entire world, and that solving it may be the death of him. *Contains moderate violence.*

In this inspirational drama based on the 2009 New York Times bestseller by Kathryn Stockett, Emma Stone is Eugenia 'Skeeter' Phelan, a plucky young writer who interviews her best friend's African-American housekeeper about her experiences working for a well-heeled white family and thereby shakes up the Deep South establishment. *Contains racism theme and one scene of crude behaviour.*

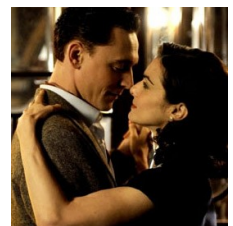


Thursday 23 February: 7:30pm

The Deep Blue Sea (12A)

Director: Terence Davies. **Starring:** Rachel Weisz, Tom Hiddleston, Simon Russell Beale. 98 mins.

Despite living a privileged life in post-war London, Hester Collyer has become disillusioned with being merely a trophy to a celebrated high court judge. In a daring move she starts up an affair with a dashing young ex-RAF pilot who duly whisks her off her feet and injects some spark back into her stagnant existence. A Shakespearean tale of passion, desire and abandonment, adapted from Terence Rattigan's seminal play. *Contains one use of strong language and suicide theme.*

The Girl with the Dragon Tattoo (18)

Director: David Fincher. **Starring:** Daniel Craig, Rooney Mara, Stellan Skarsgård. 158 mins.

In David Fincher's remake of Stieg Larsson's Millennium Trilogy adaptation, Rooney Mara plays eponymous noir punk heroine Lisbeth Salander, with Daniel Craig as Mikael Blomkvist, her journalist partner in vengeance. Expect ultra-sexy, high-octane action. 'Fincher's film is dark and twisted, bleak and brutal: everything the book's fans would want.' *Movie Talk.* *Contains strong sex and sexual violence.*
